From the loved ones of the 270 victims, representing 21 countries, to first responders, clergy, scouts, and the Lockerbie community. The group also consists of the Pan American Airways family; Syracuse University, including its Remembrance and Lockerbie scholars; and the activists leading the charge for truth, justice, accountability, and change to ensure safer skies.

Joined by tragedy yet separated by geography, the bereaved memorialized their losses in different ways on separate continents. Initially, connecting with other members of our global community was difficult, pre-internet.
